ABOUT THE DOMAINE

A medieval castle built in the 12th century, Château Lagrezette was acquired by Alain Dominique Perrin, owner-wine grower, in 1980. Although the estate has been growing the Malbec grape since 1503, the property had not been producing notable wines since the 1930s. After extensive restoration, the chateau and its 90 hectares of vines are now classified as a historic monument. Under the supervision of consultant-oenologist Michel Rolland, Chateau Lagrezette has developed a reputation for its Malbecs, which have been described by Robert Parker as the “Quintessence of Cahors”.

WINEMAKING

For this great vintage made with a plot selection, the grapes are delicately and rigorously harvested by hand. A very great wine for aging, rewarded many times by critics around the world, Paragon, as its name suggests, represents our purest jewel of the Landiech terroir. This nectar can age and improve for more than 25 years.

TASTING NOTES

Almost opaque in appearance, it offers up notes of black cherries, dried fruits, leather and liquorice. Exceptionally full-bodied this is not a wine for the faint-hearted, but it has superb balance, silky texture and a long, lingering finish.
