ABOUT THE DOMAINE

La Gabare is one of the last independent cognac houses. It was founded in 1992 by Jean Grosperrin, a cognac broker and merchant, who was able to capitalise on the close relationships he has with his clients, resulting in them allowing him to buy precious private stocks. Today, the family-owned company remains dedicated to the selection, ageing and sale of rare, old cognacs under the brand names "Cognac de Collection Jean Grosperrin" and "Cognac Le Roch." All of their products are verified and certified by the French National Scientific Research Institute guaranteeing their impeccable provenance and quality.

DISTILATION

This 1983 vintage was produced using grapes grown in the Fins Bois cru. This cru, which surrounds Cognacs heartlands and encompasses the smaller crus of Petite and Grand Champagne, is known for producing intense, powerfully flavoured Cognacs with a slightly maritime edge.

TASTING NOTES

Old gold, slightly amber reflections. On the nose, the aromas are rich, balanced and pleasant. After a few minutes, aromas of white flowers, hawthorn and liquorice take over. Smooth and supple flavours on the palete, with light notes of nutmeg and gingerbread. The finish is fresh with marine notes.
